

The Flagstaff Visitor Center is located in the historic train station along the world-renowned Route 66. Want to know more about Flagstaff and must-see attractions? Our trained information specialists can make recommendations, offer directions and suggest itineraries. For added convenience, a Red Rock Pass or local bus pass may be purchased at the Visitor Center. Flagstaff-centric, Route 66 and train-themed souvenirs are available in the gift shop, and marvel at the model train replica of the town's "Old Two Spot" as it makes its coin-operated journey around the gift shop. Open Monday-Saturday 8 a.m.-5 p.m., Sunday 9 a.m.-4 p.m. Closed Thanksgiving, Christmas and New Year's Day.

KNOW FLAGSTAFF LIKE A LOCAL

THE CITY OF 7 WONDERS

Envied by many, Flagstaff's backyard overflows with national parks and monuments. There are seven within 10 to 80 miles. Explore the depths of the Grand Canyon, peer through 800 year-old pueblo windows, and summit some peaks on your next adventure. Flagstaff's special wild places include the Coconino National Forest, San Francisco Peaks, Grand Canyon National Park, Sunset Crater Volcano National Monument, Wupatki National Monument, Walnut Canyon National Monument and Oak Creek Canyon. discoverflagstaff.com/7wonders

WORLD'S LARGEST CONTIGUOUS PONDEROSA PINE FOREST

Flagstaff sits at 7,000 feet above sea level (2,134 meters) surrounded by the largest contiguous Ponderosa pine forest in the world. One of the Southwest's tallest trees, Ponderosa pines can grow to incredible heights of 200 feet or more with trunks 4 feet wide. Find them at elevations of 6,000-8,000 feet above sea level where they form nearly pure stands covering tens of thousands of acres. fs.usda.gov/coconino

HIGHEST POINT IN ARIZONA

Humphreys Peak, the tallest of the San Francisco Peaks, is the highest point in Arizona at 12,633 feet above sea level (3,851 meters). It is followed in elevation by three other major peaks: Agassiz, Fremont and Doyle. They are the remains of an ancient volcano within the San Francisco Volcanic Field—an area boasting more than 600 volcanoes fifty miles west and east of town. Marvel at these geologic wonders with a scenic drive and hike at Sunset Crater Volcano National Monument. nps.gov/sucr

WHERE WORLD-CLASS ATHLETES TRAIN

Flagstaff-trained athletes from numerous countries have earned more than 276 Olympic and Paralympic medals. Flagstaff has a long history as an altitude training site going back to when elite athletes discovered Flagstaff in the 1960s as they prepared for the altitude-based 1968 Olympics in Mexico City. discoverflagstaff.com/highalttrn



MOON-WALKING ASTRONAUTS TRAIN IN FLAGSTAFF

Every Apollo astronaut, including the 12 men who walked on the Moon, received science training in Flagstaff. Many other contributions to NASA's Apollo Program occurred in the area during the 1960s-1970s including instrument development, lunar rover field testing and lunar mapping. Astronaut science training continues here today for the men and women of NASA's Artemis Program destined for future Moon missions. discoverflagstaff.com/lunar

WORLD'S FIRST DARK SKY CITY

The International Dark-Sky Association named Flagstaff the World's First International Dark Skies City. Protecting the night sky from light pollution supports human health and heritage, preserves wildlife habitat, saves money, and provides visual access to celestial discovery for Flagstaff's scientific research facilities such as Lowell Observatory. flagstaffdarkskies.org | lowell.edu

ADJACENT TO THE COUNTRY'S LARGEST NATIVE AMERICAN GOVERNED LANDS

Flagstaff is located near the Navajo Nation which extends 27,425 square miles—the largest area of Native American governed lands in the country. Native peoples have continuously inhabited the Colorado Plateau—the region surrounding The Four Corners area where the states of Arizona, Utah, Colorado and New Mexico meet—for approximately 12,000 years, and include the Hopi, Navajo, Zuni, Hualapai, Havasupai, Ute, Apache and Southern Paiute. Each tribe has a distinct history, culture and language. Visit the Museum of Northern Arizona to best experience the art and culture of the region's native peoples. *musnaz.org*

14 MILES OF ORIGINAL ROUTE 66

Cruise Route 66 and look back in time at iconic buildings, some still lighted with vintage neon signs. Enjoy the sights of historic hotels lining Route 66 in Flagstaff, as well as the world-famous Museum Club. Originally a Route 66 roadhouse, museum and taxidermy shop, the Museum Club is now a lively bar, music venue and Route 66 landmark. discoverflagstaff.com/route66

PACKING FOR 7,000 FEET



At high altitude, the sun is more intense and the weather can change quickly. Pack an assortment of layered clothing, a jacket, footwear appropriate for the season, sunscreen, sunglasses and a hat. If you plan to visit during the cooler months, include a fleece or flannel

shirt, warm pants, winter coat, hat, gloves, scarf and snow boots.

WINTER RECREATION MUSTS



With more than 100 inches of snowfall annually in the city, Flagstaff is designated Arizona's Official Winter Wonderland. But before you pull on your boots and load up the snowplay equipment, consult the Flagstaff Winter Recreation Snowplay Map to find official designated

snowplay areas. The map is available at the Flagstaff Visitor Center or by download at *discoverflagstaff.com/winter*. For up-to-date snow travel information, call the **Snowplay Information Hotline** at **844.256.SNOW**.

FIRE RESTRICTIONS



Please be fire aware and visit *firestrictions.us/az* before making plans to camp in the forest. During the dry summer months, fire restrictions may be put into place to restrict campfires and other activities that potentially could cause a catastrophic wildfire.

LEAVE NO TRACE



While in the forest, properly dispose of all waste including food scraps and toilet paper, or take it with you when you leave. Learn the Seven Principles of Leave No Trace by visiting *LNT.org* and keep our forests healthy.

HERITAGE & SCIENCE

THE ARBORETUM AT FLAGSTAFF

ARIZONA HISTORICAL SOCIETY PIONEER MUSEUM

U.S. GEOLOGICAL SURVEY ASTROGEOLOGY SCIENCE CENTER

The USGS works with NASA and other space agencies to lead scientific investigations, select planetary rover landing sites, create geologic maps and cartographic products for numerous spacecraft missions throughout our solar system. In 1963, the USGS Branch of Astrogeology was established in Flagstaff with the purpose of providing lunar mapping and astronaut science training for the Apollo program. One of the remaining lunar rover vehicle simulators used for training the astronauts is on display in the Center's lobby along with other Apollo artifacts.



The falls are located on Navajo Nation land-please respect private property and livestock. Camping and alcohol is prohibited.

DEAD HORSE RANCH STATE PARK

Dead Horse Ranch State Park sits on the Verde River Greenway, which is a Cottonwood-Willow riparian forest. The forest is one of less than 20 such riparian zones in the world and numerous wildlife species make the park their home. The 3,300-foot elevation accounts for mild temperatures ideal for camping, mountain biking, hiking, canoeing and fishing.

FORT VERDE STATE HISTORIC PARK

Fort Verde State Historic Park is the best-preserved example of an Indian Wars fort in Arizona. Fort Verde was the primary base for General George Crook's U.S. Army scouts and soldiers. Today, Fort Verde's Commanding Officer's, Bachelors' and Doctor's Quarters, furnished in the 1880s period, are historic house museums. Interpretive exhibits on military life, Indian Scouts and Indian Wars history are also on display.

IEROME STATE HISTORIC PARK

On the grounds of Jerome State Historic Park sits the Douglas Mansion which is now a museum devoted to the history of the Jerome area, mining and the Douglas family. The mansion has been an eye-catching landmark in Jerome since 1916 when James S. Douglas built his home on the hill above the Little Daisy Mine. The mansion was constructed of adobe bricks made on site.

LAKE POWELL NAVAJO TRIBAL PARK AND ANTELOPE CANYON

These world-renowned slot canyons are a treasured experience for any traveler. The Navajo name for Upper Antelope Canyon is Tse' bighanilini, which means "the place where water runs through rocks." Upper Antelope is about 4,000 feet elevation and the canyon walls rise 120 above the streambed. Lower Antelope Canyon is Hasdestwazi, or "spiral rock arches." Guided tours are available year-round.

No two canyons could be less alike than the Little Colorado and Grand Canyon. The narrow gorge of the Little Colorado conceals an astonishing depth. The walls are almost colorless, gray, grim and forbidding, but which hold a beauty of their own.


